It may come as a surprise to many, but faithful churchgoers do not necessarily regularly support their church financially. <i>The Generosity Challenge</i> is a four-week group study that will appeal to those who are in the pews every Sunday, but who have not yet committed to monetary giving. The study offers a weekly reading accompanied by seven days of challenges in the forms of self-assessment, journaling, and prayer. After 28 days, members of the group study are encouraged to embrace a life-giving journey toward generosity and provided a road map on how to get there.
